Degree Outcomes

The graduate of the Granite State College R.N. to B.S.N. program will help to meet society's need for a competent educated nursing workforce. The graduate will possess competencies in the following areas:

- *Citizenship characterized by significant contributions to society that are enlightened by knowledge of health care policy and politics and how they affect health care and nursing practice.*
- *Advocacy locally and nationally for social justice and equity in healthcare accessibility and quality.*
- *Use of a variety of technologies to intervene in health-related problems of individuals, families, communities, and within the health care system.*
- *Identification, evaluation, application, and/or compilation of evidence from a variety of resources to apply to health-related problems of individuals, families, communities, and the health care system.*
- *Participation as member and/or leader of teams characterized by effective communication and mutual respect that enhance the quality of health care services and their delivery.*

*An unencumbered license is required for admission. Applicants with an Associate of Science in Nursing will normally take an additional 58 credits to earn the B.S.N. A total of 90 credits is transferable to program requirements. Applicants with a prior bachelor's degree or master's degree in another field will be required to take 30 credits of nursing courses to meet the Granite State College residency requirement for the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (*general education requirements are waived*).
